JANUARY 2023: A Long Obedience

Philippians 3: ¹² Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. ¹³ Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.

For many people the end of a year and the start of another is often a time of reflection and taking stock of where they have been, and consideration of where they are headed. As disciples of Jesus Christ on pilgrimage with others from Black Hawk-Bethlehem, we also pause to evaluate how we have grown in relationship and likeness to Jesus this past year, and seek direction as we journey onward.

The essential thing "in heaven and earth" is... that there should be long obedience in the same direction; thereby results, and has always resulted in the long run, something which has made life worth living. Friedrich Nietzsche-Beyond Good and Evil

Eugene Peterson, author of the Message transliteration of the bible, published a book in 1980 called *A Long Obedience in the Same Direction*. Through it, he sought to encourage the steady, *onward and upward* movement of a disciple from the infancy of re-birth to the final consummation of faith in Jesus' eternal presence.

Peterson relates our discipleship and pilgrimage to the Psalms of Ascents (Psalm 120-134) in the Bible. These 15 Psalms were likely sung by Hebrew pilgrims as they made their way to the great worship festivals in Jerusalem. He notes that topographically, Jerusalem is the highest city in Palestine, so those who traveled there spent much of their time ascending. The metaphor is that we, disciples of Jesus Christ, are similarly on a great pilgrimage of faith throughout our lives; ever-moving onward and upward on *a Long Obedience in the Same Direction*.

As we journey this new year together with all its uncertainty, expectations, and excitement of a new beginning, may we likewise be guided by the Psalms of Ascent as we *press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of us!* Please, pray, study, and be willing to share what God is showing you each week so the worshipping community can move together as one!

We have now reached the point of decision. **BHBUMC MEMBERS:** we invite you to gather for a specially called Church Conference on **Sunday January 15, 2023 at 10:00 AM in the church sanctuary to vote whether (or not) to Disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church.**

Step 12 of the process outlines the following details for this Meeting:

- Our District Superintendent, Rev. Amanda Stein, will preside over the Meeting.
- Professing Members must sign-in next to their name on the verified printed
 Membership roll (the Membership list is posted on the kitchen bulletin board).
- The vote to Disaffiliate must be approved by a two-thirds majority vote of Professing Members present at this church conference (no proxy or absentee votes permitted).
- Written ballots must be used.
- Results must be certified and signed by an authorized officer of BHB and given to the District Superintendent as soon as meeting adjourns.

As always, we pray that you are growing in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ who is head of the Church. We covet your prayers as we attempt to be His faithful disciples.

BLACK HAWK 4th of JULY


